cooperative governance, capacity building & empowerment

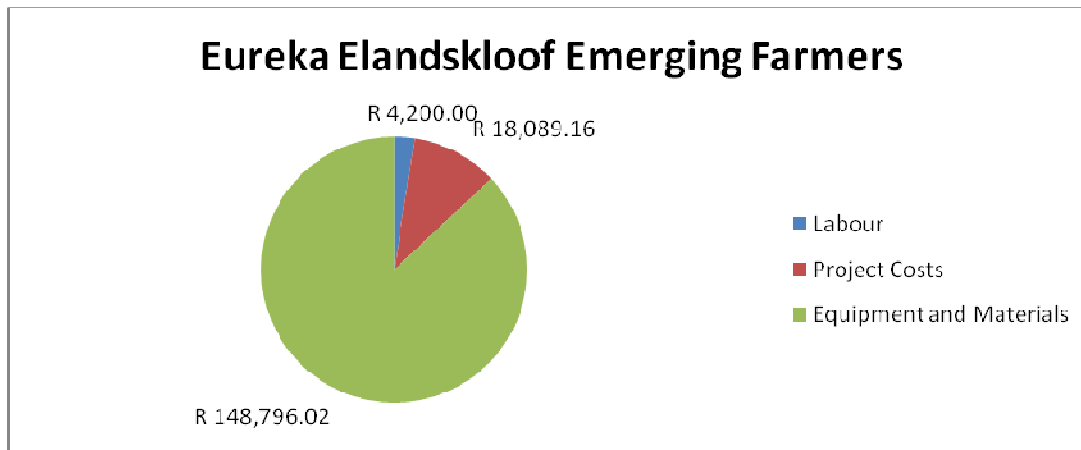


Elandskloof community won the first land restitution case in post-apartheid South Africa. Since resettling on the farm, the community has struggled through many challenges, including lack of resources and the ability to manage them effectively. The Eureka Emerging Farmers Association each work their own pieces of land farming buchu, proteas and vegetables. Eureka approached DWA IWRM to assist them with funding for irrigation systems, fencing and agricultural inputs.

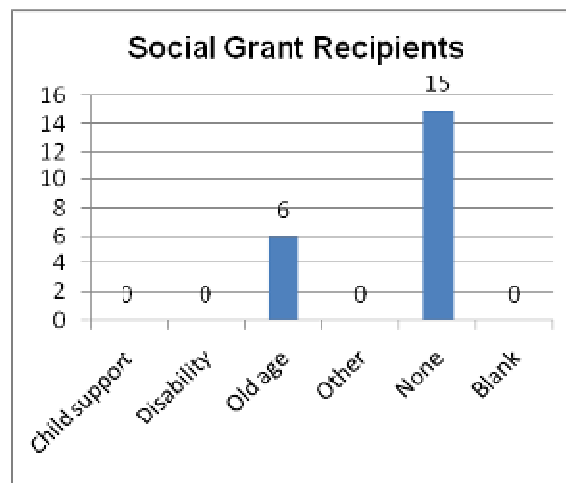
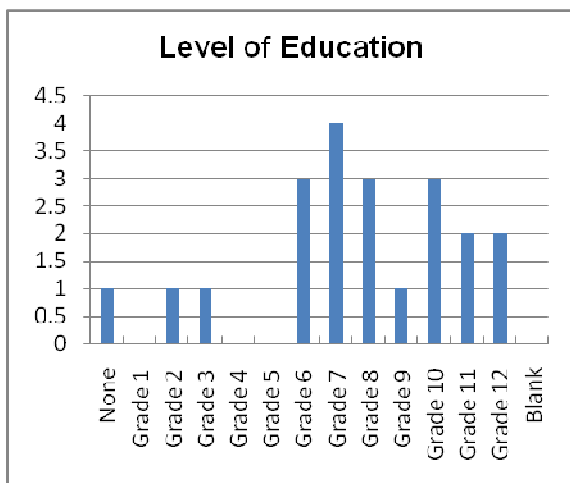
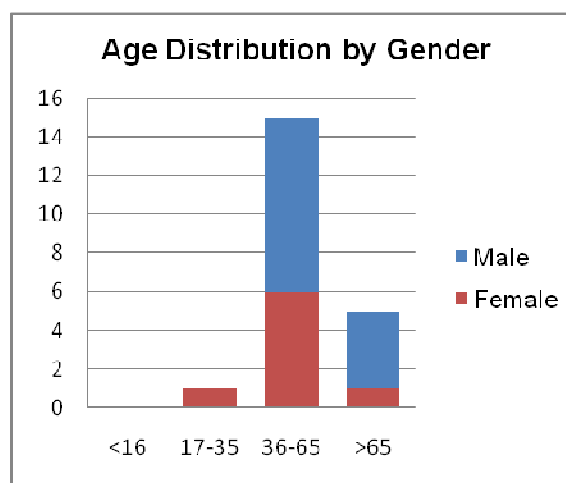
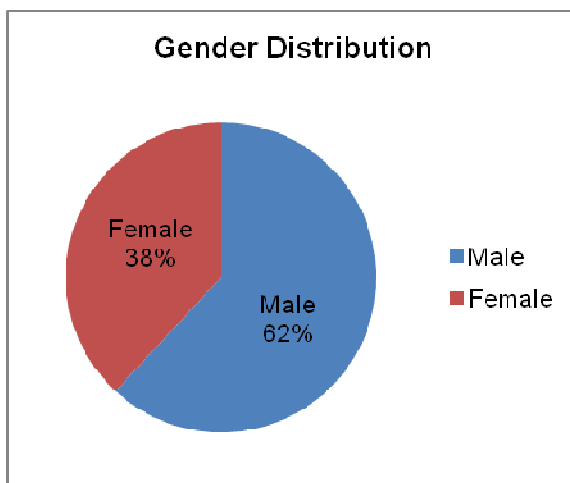
Financial Information for Eureka Emerging Farmers (EU11)

The Eureka Elandskloof Emerging Farmers was awarded a contract named IWRMII-OD-EU11-007 in 2008 to the value of R171,185.18. R171,085.18 was spent in the given contract period and the project was closed at the end of June 2009, having reached its IWRM objectives.

Of the budget allocated to this group, R148,796.02 was spent on materials and equipment to build the operations, R4,200.00 was allocated to wages and payments for work done on project tasks, and R18,089.16 was claimed to support the project management and administration tasks undertaken by the group.
