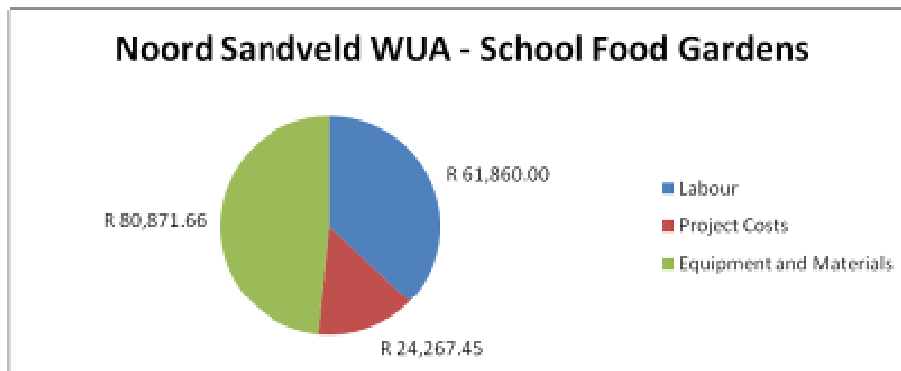
IWRM Objectives – Water management institutions, groundwater, capacity building and empowerment



The Northern Sandveld Water User Association is a newly formed association with the task of managing water resources within the northern Sandveld region of the West Coast. The association proposed a project for DWA IWRM funding to facilitate a water awareness and food garden programme in schools in Lamberts Bay and Graaffwater.

The WUA participated in the IWRM Quarterly Project Monitoring Group meetings and various capacity building initiatives, notably the IWRM Groundwater Training for Pump Operators (based on the DWAF NORAD training materials).

Financial Information for Northern Sandveld Water User Association (WN10)



The Noord Sandveld WUA - School Food Garden and rain water harvesting project was awarded a contract named IWRMII-WUA-OD-WN10-002 in 2008 to the value of R182,000.00. R166,999.11 was spent in the given contract period and the project closed at the end of August 2009 having achieved its project goals. The project's funds were augmented by R60,000 in 2009 to accommodate the groundwater monitoring installations for the Northern Sandveld Area proposed and implemented by the Department of Agriculture to monitor groundwater quality and quantity.

Of the budget allocated to this group, R80,871.66 was spent on materials and equipment to build the operations, R61,860.00 was allocated to wages and payments for work done on project tasks, and R24,267.45 was claimed to support the project management and administration tasks undertaken by the group.
